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Compliance Statement for Ceramic Products: California Proposition 65

Proposition 65, officially known as the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, was enacted as a ballot initiative in November 1986. The proposition protects the state's drinking water sources from being contaminated with chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm, and requires businesses to inform Californians about exposure to such chemicals.

Warning labels are required on all products containing naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. The warning requirements depend on the expected level of exposure to the Proposition 65 chemicals resulting from the foreseeable use of a product. The obligation to warn applies only when the foreseeable and intended use of a product containing these chemicals is likely to result in exposures exceeding the “significant risk” or “observable effect” thresholds.

SPT Roth Ltd have reviewed the latest Proposition 65 dated 21st April 2023 and found that our ceramic products do not require the Proposition 65 warning label.
